<sup>4</sup> Time to degree is the reverse of the graduation rate. Time to degree reflects the number of first time in college students who graduated from the University in a given fiscal year and then calculates backwards to track how many years it took each student to graduate from the first term the student began. It does NOT consider cohorts in the calculation. Thus, 72.0% of students who graduated in Fiscal Year 2018 completed their degree in 4 years or less.
